


With a heart full of joy I received the news that St. Joseph is celebrating its 27th year of glorious presence.







संस्कार एवं नैतिक मूल्यों पर आधारित शिक्षा आज की आवश्यकता

परिवर्तन प्रकृति का शाश्वत नियम है और प्रकृति के साथ सामन्जस्य को बनाये रखने में मनुष्य की सहज प्रवृत्ति है। उसे परिवर्तनशील बनाकर उसके बौद्धिक विकास में सहायक सिद्ध होती है और यही उसके निरन्तर विकास का पथ प्रशस्त करता परन्तु विकास की दौड़ में हम शायद अपनी विरासत, अपनी संस्कृति तथा सम्यता को भूलते जा रहे हैं जो कभी हमारी पहचान थी। उन्नति और विकास की सीढ़ी का प्रथम पायदान शिक्षा से आरम्भ होता है तो संस्कृति और संस्कार की नींव का पहला पत्थर भी शिक्षा ही है। परन्तु आज की भौतिकतावादी संस्कृति और प्रतियोगितापूर्ण वातावरण में हमारे संस्कारों की विरासत कहीं खोती जा रही है, कभी विश्व गुरु रहे भारतवर्ष में आज शिक्षा और शिक्षक के मायने बदलते जा रहे हैं, गुरु व शिष्य के बीच सम्बन्धों की गरिमा घूमिल हो रही है सम्मान तथा मर्यादा का उल्लंघन होने लगा है। आज माता-पिता, भाई-बहनों तथा अन्य पारिवारिक रिश्तों के बीच बढ़ती दूरियों निःसन्देह गम्भीर चिन्ता का विषय है। वर्तमान परिप्रेक्ष्य में हमारे आपसी सम्बन्ध भी व्यवसायिक हो चुके हैं, बच्चों में शालीनता, सौम्यता, सहनशीलता, धैर्य,

नैतिकता और परमार्थ जैसे सदगुणों का विलोपन होता जा रहा है। मानवीय मूल्यों का ह्रास होता जा रहा मनुष्यों में नैतिकता का पतन हो रहा है आज चारों तरफ असुरक्षा का माहौल व्याप्त है जिसमें खासतौर पर हमारी बेटियाँ सुरक्षित नहीं है बाहर तो छोड़ दें, बेटियाँ अपने घरों में भी स्वयं को असुरक्षित महसूस करती हैं। इसको व्यवहारिक रूप में अनुभव करते हुये मैने दी जाने वाली शिक्षा में इन गुणों को समाहित करने का निर्णय लिया।

यह तो सत्य है कि व्यक्ति भले ही कितना शिक्षित क्यों न हो जाय यदि उसमें संस्कार और सदगुणों का अभाव है तो उसकी शिक्षा व्यर्थ है। यह बात समान रूप से विद्यार्थियों के साथ-साथ शिक्षा प्रदान करने वाले शिक्षकों पर भी लागू होती है। जब स्वयं शिक्षक में सदगुणों और संस्कारों का अभाव होगा तो वह अपने विद्यार्थियों को किस स्तर की शिक्षा देगा। इसमें कोई सन्देह नहीं है कि आज प्राथमिक स्तर की शिक्षा भी व्यवसायिक हो चुकी है। परन्तु एक शिक्षाविद् होने के कारण मैने व्यवसायिकता के स्थान पर समाजवादिता और परिवार भावना को प्राथमिकता दी और विद्यालय में आधुनिक उपकरणों से युक्त आधुनिक शिक्षा प्रदान करने के साथ-साथ विद्यार्थियों में नैतिकता, चारित्रिकता, आध्यात्मिकता, अपनत्व तथा आपसी सहयोग जैसे सदगुणों को भी व्यक्तित्व में समाहित किया जिसका परिणाम आज अमृतफल के रूप में सामने है। न जाने कितने छात्र-छात्रायें आज डाक्टर, इन्जीनियर, बैंक अधिकारी, वैज्ञानिक तथा प्रशासनिक अधिकारी बनकर समाज की सेवा कर रहे हैं। उनके माता-पिता, भाई-बहन उन पर गर्वान्वित हो रहे हैं। मैं अभिभावकों से खास तौर पर माताओं से कहना चाहूँगी कि वे अपने बच्चों में अच्छे संस्कार डाले, आरम्भ ही से लड़कियों के प्रति सम्मान की भावना का बीजारोपण करें।

आज माता-पिता से अधिक यह दायित्व शिक्षा प्रदान करने वाले संस्थानों का हो गया है कि वे डिग्री के साथ-साथ मानवीय मूल्यों की शिक्षा भी प्रदान करें। विद्यार्थी अच्छे शिक्षाविद् वैज्ञानिक, खिलाड़ी, अधिकारी, उद्योगपति कुछ भी बनें परन्तु इसके पूर्व वे एक अच्छे सदगुणों से सम्पन्न एक इन्सान बनें। सेंट जोजफ विद्यालय की स्थापना का मेरा उद्देश्य ही यही था और आज स्थापना के छब्बीस वर्ष पूर्ण होने पर मैं गर्व का अनुभव करते हुये यह कह सकती हूँ कि विद्यालय शिक्षा के साथ नैतिक मानवीय मूल्यों और संस्कारों के साथ प्रोषित व पल्लवित एक नयी पीढ़ी समाज व राष्ट्र को देकर अपने कर्तव्यों का निर्वहन पूरी सच्चाई तथा ईमानदारी से करता आ रहा है।

"To move freely you must be deeply rooted"

There is so much depth in this sentence. To live your life freely but keeping your moral values, your beliefs and at the same time while not missing out the fun of the age in which you are in, that's what I would like to elaborate on today.

As a teacher, as an educator its easy for me to talk about moralities in a conventional way. But for once I take off that tag from me and take back leap to my own teen age. I realize one thing that although I was self disciplined, with strong values and acted as was expected from me, some where I did not live the happiness of that moment. Those were the restrictions out of respect and fear rather than my own will. And, it was more or less the story for every teenager at that age and time. Todays scenario is changed totally. Children are not treated as parents' possession. They have their own identity they have more space and more liberties.

But then what is the result of this liberty? Most of you as teenagers do not understand the real meaning of freedom.

Indisciplined behaviour forgetting to respect authority, breaking rules at their own will, smoking, drinking, rash driving, late night outs, threatening on parents, bunking classes and some times indulgence in illegal activities, is what come out of this shallow meaning of freedom.

What exactly then this quote mean? It means to free your spirit, to go ahead and try to fulfill your dreams, to open your wings to take a leap to grow but never forgetting what is right and what is wrong. For me personally freedom means self discipline to have a deep faith in your values to understand that these values are not to restrict you from the happiness but to know in what the true happiness lies. This is what our revered President Dr. APJ Abdul Kalam also had in mind when he envisioned a developed India by 2020. We need to develop only one generation properly for this vision to come true.

This is where the teachers have an important role to play. None else is in a better position to communicate with the youth than our teachers are. A teacher-taught relation can be most objective as well as without any lower selfishness. It takes time to understand the aspirations of youth and the teachers can find this time, if they wish to do so. From this viewpoint, teachers have to do some soul-searching as well as work hard. I am sure, if they do so the gain is certainly going to be more than the pain, both at the individual level as well as at the social level. Construction of a good human personality is any day more productive and meaningful than the construction of a building or business, enterprise. Such construction may not be visible to anyone but a constructive mind only leads to the process of true national development.

Surely there are difficulties, but then every great task has them. It is not the time of talking about them as we have done enough of it and know well about them. We also know the solutions but they are still expressed only in the form of 'should'. It is now time to talk in terms of 'will'. Instead of preaching, it is now time to practice these preachings. It has been rightly said that one ounce of practice is better than a ton of precept. In the present circumstances we need many ounces of it. There are many success stories in all the fields and they should be our inspiration. The age-old value system of mankind still holds good. Whatever be the social scenario, we still appreciate good and condemn bad. It is only the question of taking the lead. Aristotle calls this as enlightened selfishness and says that doing a good deed is not act of self-sacrifice but of self-preservation. If at all we want to be selfish, let us be so in an enlightened manner. That is a must for our self-preservation too. With these words I conclude with reaffirmation in my conviction that future is bright and we need not be unduly negative in the assessment of the situation. After all when we rebuild, destruction precedes construction. To me, the present situation is only a process of constructive destruction. The youth will surely take up this task to the logical end and our teachers will be able to harness their energies in the right direction.

Why Children Misbehave

Many parents ask, why is my child acting this way? Children misbehave for much reason. The information given here will help the parents to understand why their child misbehaves? Once you understand why a young child is misbehaving, it is easier to choose effective guidance techniques to handle the situations. Children need to feel that they belong to you, to the class at school to a group of friends. They may misbehave to gain membership or to find out if they will still be accepted. Thus it is important to let children know you love them and that they are still part of the family, even when they behave badly.

Children misbehave to get attention. To a child, any kind of attention is better than no attention. Some children feel their parents do not like them or do not talk or spend time with them. Therefore these children set up to gain attention. Children who feel this way may even try to get in trouble to be noticed by parents. Give your child attention when he or she is behaving well. Don't make your child misbehave to get your attention.

Children misbehave when they lack confidence. They may act out when afraid to try new things or fear failure at a new task. Help children understand that everyone makes mistake.

Children misbehave when they are discouraged. Adults are often too quick to tell a child when they do something wrong and forget to tell them what they are doing right. Children who believe that they are bad will act bad, and perhaps hurt others. A child who believes he/ she is stupid will not do well in school. Children need praise and approval, even for small things like saying thank you. This prevents them from having to misbehave to get attention. Be generous and sincere with your approval and praise. Try to say at least first five positive things to your child for each time you criticize, you must praise but it should be about the course of action your child has taken, not about your child. For instance, you did a good job of picking up the toys is better than saying, you are good boy for picking up the toys

Children feel love and acceptance when you listen to them, talk about their thoughts, feelings and safety.



No Time For Studies


A Year has 365 days,

Evacuate and sleep".


