
Count Your Blessings

Kabir (1398 A.D.) The Great Bhakt

Kabir was the most important reformer of the Bhakti Movement. But unfortunately we do not know anything definite about his early life. Some say that he was born of a Hindu widow who threw him away to escape defame and consequently he was brought up by a muslim weaver. There are some who could even suggest that he was originally a Muslim but came under, the influence of Hinduism. Anyhow it is certain that he was the most famous disciple of Ramanand in the 1st half of 15th century A.D. He was born in Banaras (in about 1398 A.D.) and was a weaver by profession.



Kabir's teachings are contained in his writings which are still sung with great pleasure even up to this day. In them he preached against Caste distinction supremacy of the Brahmanas image worship, rituals and ceremonies, pilgrimage to the so called holy places and insincerity and hypocrisy. Against image worship he says: "If by worshiping stones one can find God I shall worship a mountain?. Better than their stones is a stone of the flow mill with which men grind the corn".

Similarly against insincerity he remarks "it is not by fashion repeating prayers and the creed. One goes to heaven, the inner veil of the temple of me in man's heart, if truth he knows"

Kabir makes no distinction between the Hindus and the Muslim. They are pots of same and are only follow different routes to reach a common goal. Bathing in the Ganga and pilgrimage to Mecca are useless if the heart is not pure. He reproached both the 'Muslim and the 'Pandits' alike and spared none. One can attain freedom from transmigration by means of Bhakti on sincere devotion to God.

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योगासन एवं व्यायाम से लाभ

योगासिद्धि एवं शरीर शुद्धि के लिए योगासन जरूरी है। यही कार है कि आज विज्ञान के इस दौर में योग शिक्षा प्राप्त करने के लिए लोग इच्छुक हैं। सरल शब्दों में कहें तो सुखपूर्वक एवं निरछल बैठने की मुद्रा ही योग आसन कहलाती है। योगासन व व्यायाम एक नहीं है लेकिन दोनों के फायदे एक समान हैं। व्यायाम आसन हर दृष्टिकोण से फायदेमंद है। व्यायाम से एक ही कसरत को कुछ समय तक लगातार किया जाता है। ऐसा करने से शरीर जहाँ थक जाता है वहीं पसीना भी आने लगता है। योगासन में ऐसा नहीं होता, व्यायाम करते समय एक अंग विशेष की कसरत होती है जबकि आसन में शरीर के सभी अंगों पर उसका प्रभाव पड़ता है। व्यायाम करने के बाद जहाँ शरीर में थकावट होने लगती है वहीं थोड़ी देर तक किसी शरीर काम को करने की इच्छा भी नहीं करती। योगासन से शरीर में थकावट भी अनुभव नहीं होती और शरीर हल्का भी लगने लगता है। योगासन करते समय शरीर के सभी अंग प्रभावित होते हैं।

जिसने आसन को जीत लिया उसने तीनों लोकों को जीत लिया। इसी प्रकार विधि विद्यान से प्राणायाम का अभ्यास करना चाहिए।

कहा भी गया हैस कि जिसने आसनों की सिद्धि को प्राप्त हो जाती है। इस प्रकार शरीर के समस्त विकार दूर हो जाते हैं। इसलिए यह कहने में कोई संदेह नहीं कि आसनों के द्वारा शरीर के रोगों को दूर किया जा सकता है और साथ – साथ स्वस्थ मारिस्तिक का विकास भी होता है।

व्यायाम का अनुशासन से सीधा संबंध है। हमें शरीर को स्वस्थ बनाये रखने के लिए व्यायाम की आवश्यकता होती है। दूसरी शब्दों में यह भी कहा जा सकता है कि शरीर को विस्तार देने की क्रियाएं व्यायाम हैं।





TEACHING METHODOLOGY AT SJIS

INDEPENDENCE

"Never help a child with a task at which he feels he can succeed." Maria Montessori.

It is always a goal of Montessori education in the classrooms to make the child independent and enable him to do things on his own. This is achieved by giving children enough opportunities. Opportunities to move, to dress themselves, to choose what they want to do. When the children are able to do things for themselves there is an increase in their self belief, self confidence and esteem that they may carry on throughout their life.



OBSERVATION

देती है वहाँ न तो जल निकासी की कोई व्यवस्था है और न ही शौचालय जिसके कारण गंदगी फैलती है और वातावरण दूषित होता है।

स्वच्छता की दृष्टि से तीर्थस्थलों व पर्यटन स्थलों का भी बुरा हाल है। वहाँ अधिकांश संख्या में लोग आते हैं, प्रकृति की सुन्दरता वा आध्यात्मिक वातावरण का लाभ लेते हैं, और बदले में वहाँ के वातावरण को गंदा करके चले जाते हैं। आजकल तो खाद्य सामग्रियाँ प्लास्टिक की थैलियों में मिलती है यहाँ तक कि पीने का पानी भी प्लास्टिक की बोतलों और थैलियों में मिलती है अतः इनका इस्तेमाल करना और इधर-उधर फेंक देना जनसामान्य के लिए एक आम बात हो गयी है।


वात केवल गंदगी फैलने तक ही सीमित नहीं रहती बल्कि उस गंदगी में अनेक हानिकारक कीड़े पनपते हैं जो अनेक संक्रामक रोगों को जन्म देते हैं। यही कारण है कि सर्दी व गर्मी की अपेक्षा वर्षा ऋतु में संक्रामक रोग तीव्रता से फैलता है।

सब जानते हैं और सब मानते भी हैं, कि कूड़ा-कचरा फैलाना नहीं चाहिए, साफ-सफाई रखनी चाहिए लेकिन लोग फैली हुई गंदगी को अनदेखा कर उसे बढ़ाने का कार्य करते हैं। जब तक गंदगी को अनेकदखा किया जाएगा, उसे साफ करने का प्रयास नहीं किया जाएगा, वह फैलती ही जाएगी, और एक दिन यह समस्या इतनी अधिक बढ़ जाएगी कि उसे साफ करना संभव नहीं होगा, फिर उसे साफ करने के लिए अभियान चलाया जाएगा तो क्यों न हम इसे शुरू से ही फैलने न दें।

स्वच्छता की शुरुआत छोटे बच्चों के प्रशिक्षण से होनी चाहिए और बड़ों को भी उस पर अमल करना चाहिए। स्वच्छता हेतु आवश्यक है कि गंदगी को इधर-उधर न फेंक कर कूड़ेदान में फेंके। इस समस्या के समाधान का एक उपाय यह भी है कि कचरे का वर्गीकरण कर दिया जाए। जो सड़ने गलने वाले कूड़े हैं उन्हें अलग कूड़ेदान में तथा जो सड़ते नहीं जैसे प्लास्टिक, काँच, धातु आदि को अलग कूड़ेदान में डाला जाए। जिससे इनका प्रबंधन किया जा सके और कचरे का पुनर्चक्रण (रिसाइक्लिंग) करके पुनः उपयोग में लाया जा सके।

जिस कचरे को हम एक गंभीर समस्या के रूप में लेते हैं, उसका समुचित प्रबंधन करके उससे देश को समृद्ध बनाया जा सकता है। आप आवश्यकता है सही कदम उठाने को यदि प्रत्येक व्यक्ति अपनी जिम्मेदारी समझकर यह शुरुआत करे तो इस समस्या का निराकरण संभव है।
